

Rules and Etiquette for ICA (Intermediate Course Authorization)

Player behavior and knowledge on the course

Dress code

No blue jeans, jogging suits or tank tops. Sports or golf shoes.

Equipment

Golf bag, balls, tees, pitch forks.

<u>Safety</u>

If your ball is heading towards another player, warn of the danger by shouting the word "FORE"

Accompanying person

In order to play the course, a player with a handicap of less than 30 must accompany the person who has obtained their ICA.

Pace of play

Be aware that a beginner should not slow down the game. To do this after a missed shot, pick up your ball and put it down at the same height as the ball of your ball (100 meters away).

The pace of the walk should be steady and committed.

Course Etiquette

- Avoid damaging the ground when trying to hit the tee shots.
- Replace divots on the course (pieces of grass).
- Repair pitches on the greens (holes made by the ball), use the picht lifter to repair them.
- Rake the bunkers (sand obstacles).
- Place your bag at the height of your ball position and in front of your when you play.
- As you approach the green, observe where the next tee is and place your equipment on the path to it.

Etiquette towards other players

- When someone is playing → do not talk, keep your distance, watch the player and look at the ball.
- On the green → do not walk on the playing lines and stand outside the player's field of vision of the player.

Field markings and rules to know

Starting marks

•	Red	\rightarrow	Ladies category 15.1 to 54 handicap
•	Blue	\rightarrow	Ladies category 0 to 15.0 handicap
•	Yellow	\rightarrow	Men's handicap category 9.5 to 54
•	White	\rightarrow	Men's handicap category 0 to 9.4
